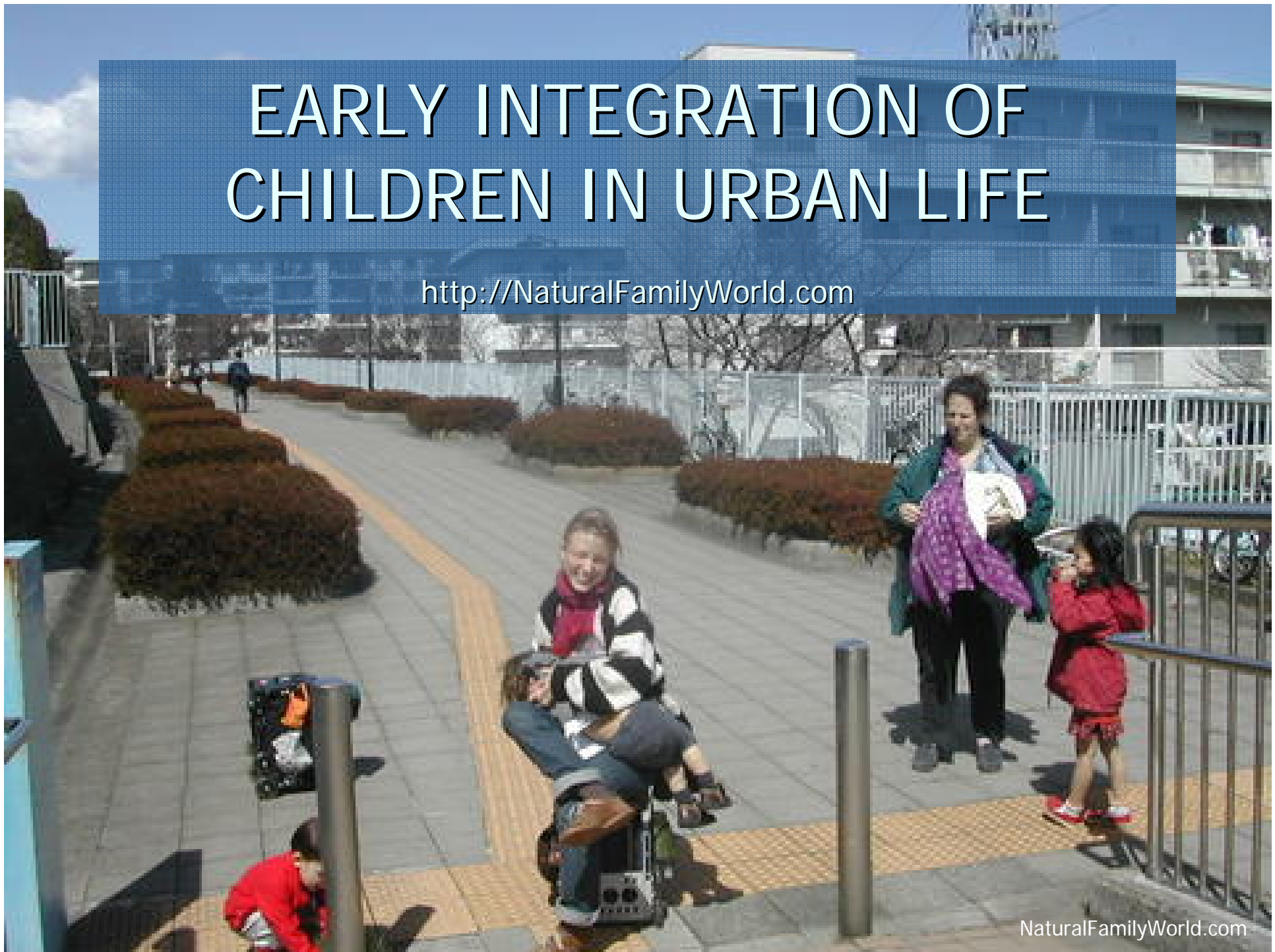


# EARLY INTEGRATION OF CHILDREN IN URBAN LIFE
